Re: *NTI et al. v. Attorney General of Canada*
Nunavut Court of Justice Action No. 08-06-713-CVC
Our File No. 5011-41

I am writing to provide answers to the three matters on which Justice Johnson ordered further particulars in his decision dated November 19, 2007.

1. The words “governmental obligations” in paragraph 16 of the Amended Statement of Claim include the Government of Nunavut.
2. The recommendations of the Conciliator which Canada declined to implement are as follows:
 - (a) it did not implement the recommendations of the Conciliator endorsing the *Report on the State of Consensus in the Nunavut Implementation Panel on Some Aspects of Structural Reform and IPG Funding Levels (“NIP Report”)*;
 - (b) it did not take timely action to fund IPGs in the ways set out in the *Report* and endorsed by the Conciliator;
 - (c) it did not take any action on the recommendations of the Conciliator in regards to near-term training initiatives relating to Article 23 of the Agreement;


(d) it did not allocate, expend, approve for expenditure, transfer or otherwise make available the funding recommended by the Conciliator in relation to six near-term training initiatives described on page 59 of the Conciliator's Final Report;

(e) it did not take any action to give effect to the recommendations of the Conciliator in relation to the creation of a program of bilingual education in Nunavut capable of meeting Article 23 objectives;

(f) it did not respond to the Conciliator's recommendations in relation to the IPG funding issues contained in the *NIP Report* or in relation to implementation of Article 23.

3. The Plaintiff does not take the position that it has standing to represent the Government of Nunavut.
