


Given these deficiencies, the current version of an EDU IEP does not constitute, in any rational and acceptable sense, the much overdue and badly needed “plan” to train and hire Inuit educators. The Members can have no justifiable hope that Bill 25 and the EDU IEP, together or individually, will deliver on the promise of a successful education for our Inuit students. As you may be aware, NTI has commenced a dispute resolution process to attempt to resolve the issue of the deficiencies of this and other Inuit Employment Plans.

For this reason, I urge you to respond positively to NTI’s January 30, 2020 letter proposing a participatory approach to a mutually acceptable understanding as to the critical amendments to be made to the *Education Act*. Such discussions will, by necessity, also address the necessary improvements to the EDU IEP. Given the passage of time and the importance of these discussions, NTI is seeking your response to that proposal as soon as possible.

I would be happy to meet with the Standing Committee or any members to discuss this further. Thank you for your consideration of the above.
