Under the direction of the Director of Self-Determination; your central role is to oversee, plan and manage the “project” of a negotiation, eventual implementation of self-government agreement(s). This role will be multi-faceted in nature; it will liaise between NTI’s Departments, Regional Inuit Associations as well as external partners such as the Government of Nunavut, Inuit Tapiriit Kanatami, the Government of Canada, communities and other stakeholders. You will assist with the development of workplans and implementation strategies within established timelines. You will assist with the budgets allocated for the different project areas, including contribution agreements and pilot projects, organize and facilitate focus group meetings. The Project Manager will assist in the development of activity and annual reports on NTI’s progress in self-government initiatives.

To be invited for an interview; you are required to have knowledge of the mandate of NTI, and the *Nunavut Agreement*.; Demonstrated experience in project management; ability to think strategically and focus on multiple activities; demonstrated work experience in Inuit organizations and community engagement; excellent communication (oral & written) skills, interpersonal and teambuilding skills required to develop effective working relationships with staff, communities and partner agencies.

Preference will be given to Inuit enrolled under the Nunavut Agreement.
