#### Position Summary

The Social Policy Analyst will coordinate and undertake drafting of reports, positions papers and other relevant documents. This position will participate on National and Territorial Committees/Working Groups to advance policy and advocacy on NTI priorities and positions related to justice and other social issues. The incumbent will have the ability to work co-operatively with a variety of individuals and groups and must be able to develop and maintain strong working relationships and have the ability to work independently.

#### Qualifications
